

After a great start to the game we could and should have put the tie to bed but were made to pay for the missed chances as the visitors worked their way back into the match.

Attendances too are being affected, not only by people cutting back expenditure, but also by crowds flocking back to Portman Road after several years of declining attendance, so I'd like to close my column by thanking each and every one of you for coming today and doing your bit to help us continue moving forward, it really is appreciated.

There's been plenty of debate surrounding the decision to postpone last weekend's football action following the passing of HM The Queen. You may have noticed we as a club haven't entered the debate. I'm a great believer in only focusing on the things you can control. There's no point wasting energy on something we have no control over. It is what it is, we respect the circumstances, acknowledge you'll never please everyone regardless of the decision, and move on.


SEASIDERS CAPTURE FORMER ITFC DEFENDER



Not many people know this ...

In my youth I was a soldier and one of the postings I had was to Cyprus. I had the best of times there, living amongst the local community in Larnaca, with my wife & new-born son.

Being in the Royal Engineers we were fortunate to see much of the Island as part of our 'job' and I'm pretty sure the object of the Engineers in Cyprus was to concrete the Island, or so it seemed, being at the lower end of the promotion ladder.

However, one of the big plusses was our working hours, in the summer it was 07:30-13:30 as it was considered too hot to work (concrete) in the afternoon, allowing us time to sightsee and enjoy the beaches. I have strong memories of visiting Famagusta, then a virtually derelict town in the Turkish controlled part of the Island (check out EOKA for history) and visiting a site of historical value called Salamis, a few kilometres north of FamaG.

My wife also has strong memories of an afternoon spent at Salamis in amongst the ancient ruins of a once significant and clearly magnificent city, this was 1966 and there were no organised tours just an old man who spoke



broken English showing us different things he thought of interest as we walked around freely over antiquities we never really appreciated at the time. But my wife reminded me that she learnt from the old sage that the ancient Greeks were the first to use central heating! They invented a system called a hypocaust – using spaces under floors and pipes in walls to force air through, ingenious!

Now here we are 56 years later welcoming New Salamis to the AGL arena, not quite to the same standard as the Salamis amphitheatre of 3000 BC (circa 1966), but welcome to you all.

THE OTHER SIDE: NEW SALAMIS FC



CLUB HISTORY

New Salamis FC were formed in 1974 by fans of Cypriot club Nea Salamis Famagusta, with the Cypriot based club acting as a parent club to their fans in the UK. Playing in the KOPA (Cypriot Football League) a British League set-up for Cypriots in London, the club won countless honours and left the league in season 2017/18 as the leagues most successful team, winning 12 League Titles. The club also won a record 7 London County Cups.

In the 2015/16 season the club won the FA Sunday Cup, following a 1-1 draw with Barnes at Selhurst Park and winning on penalties. In 2016/17 the club lost to Hardwick Social Club on penalties again following a 1-1 draw, at Brammall Lane. Many of the players still play for the team today.

In 2018/19 we moved into the Herts County Senior League, playing our matches at Enfield Town FC. In our first season we won the prestigious Aubrey Cup Final, and also achieved promotion to the Spartan South Midlands League, after finishing runners up.

Season 2019/20 saw us participate in the Spartan South Midlands League Division One at Step 6, our ambition to achieve promotion to Step 5.

In March 2020 when the Covid-19 pandemic hit, we sat top of the certain of a top four finish and promotion. We also were the top scorers in all top 10 Divisions as the season was null and voided.

Season 2020-21 saw the club enter the FA Cup for the first time and reach the first round proper of the FA Cup, after beating, Colney Heath 1-0, West Essex 5-1 and losing in the First round to Brentwood Town FC. When the season was curtailed in November, we had managed to amas enough

points to be promoted to the Premier Division on points per game over two season.

Champions of the Spartan Premier Division, in Season 2021-22, winning the league on the last day of the season 2-0 at Risborough Rangers, would see the club achieve its 3rd promotion in 4 seasons, and we will play in the Isthmian North Division in 2022-23.

A rapid rise from our humble beginnings, but one that has been a great rollercoaster journey, all aboard the Red machine to see what comes next.





aris has become one of the most productive factories of football talent in the world in recent years, with world class players seemingly coming out of the city like there is no tomorrow. And when we think of football clubs in Paris, one name springs to mind. But Paris Saint-Germain, founded by the merger of Paris FC and Stade Saint-Germain, only came into being in 1970. Paris FC have since split from the project, but themselves were only founded a year earlier in 1969, while Stade Saint-Germain have a much longer history, going back to 1904. But if we want to find the origins of football in Paris, we have to go back even further than that, and to a man whose name echoes as loudly as anyone's through footballing history.

In 1897, Ernest Webber sat in a Paris café with a friend, discussing the lack of a welcoming sports club that they could join. The friend proposed that they start their own, which would open its doors to anybody of any background, and any income. His name, as it happened, was Jules Rimet, and his club,





named after the ferry company chosen by his childhood governess, was Red Star FC.

Always taking the English variant of the name (no *L'Etoile Rouge* here, though it has become a nickname), the club initially started life playing in the Champs de Mars, a beautifully picturesque space right next to the Eiffel Tower, in the third division of a nascent national French championship. They soon moved to Meudon, in the southwest of the city, and just as rapidly, moved up the leagues. By 1904, under the presidency of Rimet, they were in the top flight.

In 1907, the club moved to Saint-Ouen in the north of the city, to the brand new Stade de Paris, which is still its home (though it is now called the Stade Bauer). The forerunner to the French FA, the USFSA, was in disarray, so the club joined a new organisation, and a new league, which they won in 1912, but by 1919 the French Football Federation had been established, and with it some efficiency and, auspiciously for Red Star, a new national cup competition. They became founder members of Ligue 1.

In 1921, Red Star began providing increasing numbers of players to the national team, most notably goalkeeper Pierre Chayrigues (who had been approached by Tottenham as early as 1913) and star striker Paul Nicolas, and this core of internationals saw them to the first of three consecutive Coupe de France victories. against city rivals Olympique de Paris, who would later merge with the Saint-Ouen based club. The following season saw them defeat Rennes 2-0, before a 4-2 victory in 1923 against CA Paris (who, incidentally, were one of the clubs that rejected Rimet) and secure three-in-arow, and meant that Red Star had won three of the first five iterations of the competition (or six, if a wartime dummy run is included from 1918). The would beat CA Paris again in 1928 for their fourth.

1930 saw the beginning of what would become a long-lasting decline for the club. The Federation voted for a professionalisation of the league, and despite their success in the 1920s and their early adoption of the motion, Red Star would finish in the bottom three in the first professional season of French football. Ironically, this just meant a little more history for the club, as relegation made them founder memvers of Lique 2, just as they had been founder members of Ligue 1. They won the division at the first attempt and returned to the top flight, but the appointment of playermanager, legend of the future Guillermo Stabile was not enough to re-establish them at the top of French football. In 1939, as war was breaking out, he left to manage the



Argentine national side.

A wartime Coupe de France in 1942, with another legendary Argentinian manager, Helenio Herrera, as a player, was the last honour Red Star secured, and their decline in the post-war period was stark. In 1950 they dropped as far as the third division, and despite a handful of individual seasons back at the top table, they have spent the rest of their history bouncing between the second and third divisions.

Despite the rise and fall, however, Red Star have retained Jules Rimet's initial belief in remaining an open and inclusive club for all in Paris. While their billionaire-backed neighbours break world records to bring the global footballing elite to the Parc des Princes, Red Star run community outreach programmes in textiles, literature, music, and of course football. Who knows, if Paris keeps producing talent like it has been, this outreach might just drive them back to the top.
