Felixstowe and Walton United hoped to regain their place in the top five as they welcomed Witham Town. The Seasiders were one of three sides with a perfect home record - seven wins

from seven going into this one - and had already defeated Town this season, a three-one win in the Velocity Cup, so it was little surprise that they did that again and made it eight from eight. The margin of victory was slightly larger this time, and all the goals came after the break. Noel Aitkens opened the scoring three minutes after half time, and just after the hour Josh Hitter made it two. Fifteen minutes from time Jamahl Godward halved the deficit, but if the visiting faithful had dreams of a point they were soon ended, two spot kicks - both converted by Joe Whight - making it four-one at full time. That's one win from eleven for Witham, as United go fifth.

THE OTHER SIDE BURY TOWN

Founded in 1872, Bury Town Football Club is one of the oldest Football Club's in the country and has a proud history dating back over 140 years. The club was founded by Mr William Lake at a meeting in the Suffolk Hotel. The original name of the club was Bury St Edmunds FC and the first committee of the club elected to choose royal blue as the club's colours.

The club took up residence at Kings Road, also know as the Cemetery Road ground, in 1888. Kings Road was the first football ground in East Anglia to operate floodlights when on Monday 12th January 1953, the Blues played their first ever floodlit game against Cambridge City in front of 2,105 spectators. A total of 14 bulbs of 1500 watts illuminated the Suffolk skyline for the first time and history was created. The lights were financed by the Bury Town Supporters Club.



A notable player for the club in the early days was Reginald De Courtney Welch who appeared as a defender for Bury St Edmunds in 1877. De Courtney Welch was a member of The Wanderers side that won the first ever FA Cup in 1872 and he also played in the first ever official international match for England, against Scotland in November 1872.

The club was one of 11 founder members of the Suffolk County Football Association in 1885 and has won the Suffolk Premier Cup on 13 occasions.

The clubs name was changed by a vote to Bury Town in September 1885, however 10 years



later the members chose to adopt the full name of the town back as the name, before changing to Bury United in 1908. In 1923 the clubs members decided that the name 'United' was no longer appropriate as there were a number of sides in Bury St Edmunds, and decided to revert to Bury Town, which has remained to this day.

The club played in various local leagues until 1935 when it became a founder member of the Eastern Counties League. The club spent a total of 22 consecutive seasons in the Eastern Counties League, finishing as runners up in 1937-38. The Blues claimed the ECL title in the 1963-64 season as part of an historic treble, as they also captured the ECL Knockout Cup and the Suffolk Premier Cup.

This success saw the club move to the Metropolitan League and they kicked off their first ever Metropolitan game against Charlton Athletic 'A' at Kings Road in front of 1,150 spectators, Bury running out 1-0 winners. The club finished 4th in their first season and also retained the Suffolk Premier Cup.

Season 1965-66 was another successful season and another treble haul of trophies as the club stormed to the Metropolitan League title, won the Metropolitan League Cup and the Suffolk Premier Cup again. By this time the club were averaging over 1,000 supporters at their home matches and interest in the club was at an all time high.

In 1968, the Blues reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup and drew Third Division side Bournemouth & Boscombe at Kings Road. 3,000 spectators assembled and witnessed Bury hold the Football League side to a goalless draw. The replay saw Bournemouth win through by 3 goals to 0 at Dean Court. The season had further success when the Blues won the Metropolitan League title for a second time.

The clubs success resulted them taking the bold step to join the Southern Football League for the 1971-72 season. The club struggled to adapt to their new surroundings and after five seasons, decided to take the decision to re-join the Eastern Counties League, a decision that



proved unpopular with supporters.

On Wednesday 28th April 1976, Bury Town played their final match at the historic Kings Road ground when West Ham United were the visitors. 1,750 watched on as the sides drew 2-2, and a pitch invasion signalled the end of the Blues spiritual home.

Bury Town moved into their current Ram Meadow ground in 1978 and collected the Suffolk Premier Cup as a reward. The Blues spent a total of 11 seasons back in the ECL and their most successful moment of that time came in their final season when the reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup and were drawn away at Football Conference leaders Enfield. The sides drew 0-0 at Southbury Road and returned to Ram Meadow for the replay, however in front 2,500 supporters, the visitors sneaked home 1-0 to reach the First Round Proper.

The 1987-88 season saw ambition return to the club and Bury were promoted to the Southern League. After a few seasons of promising results and large home crowds, the Blues failed to reach the Premier Division, the closest they came was finishing 4th in 1988-89. Years of overspending on players and ground improvements finally caught up and the club drifted into decline as the crowds drifted away. On the 4th May 1996, the Blues were relegated at Redditch United from the Midland Division of the Southern League, back to the Eastern Counties League.



The club spent another 10 years in the ECL, and despite some early seasons of struggles, success coincided with the appointment of former Colchester United captain Richard Wilkins



to the manager's seat. The club reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 2005 and then the Semi Final in 2006. Crowds rose back up and after two consecutive runners up spots in the Premier Division of the ECL, the club were promoted to the Isthmian League for the first time in their history. The stay lasted two seasons and after adjusting to a higher level in 2006–07 with a 17th place finish, the following season saw the Blues finish in 7th position.

The FA re-organisation in 2008 saw Bury moved into the Southern League for a third spell of membership. A successful campaign saw Bury finish in 7th position in the Midland Division table, reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing 4-2 at Alfreton Town, and reach the Semi Final of the Southern League Cup, however in 2009-10, Bury Town clinched the Southern League Midland Division Championship on the final day of the season with a 3-0 home victory over Marlow in front of 1,550 supporters. The Blues piped Hitchin Town to the title, scoring 115 goals during the campaign and collecting 102 points to gain promotion. Another move across the pyramid saw the Blues re-join the Ryman League for the 2010-11 season, entering the Premier Division. A great season saw Bury finish third, but go out of the play off's to Lowestoft Town. There was however some silverware for the boardroom as Bury defeated Needham Market 2-0 in the final of the Suffolk Premier Cup at Portman Road.

20011-12 saw the club lift the Ryman League Cup with a victory over East Thurrock United and again finished in the play off places, but lost out to AFC Hornchurch in the Semi Final. 2014-15 saw our spell in the Premier Division come to an end after 5 years with relegation to Division One North. In our last two seasons back in Division One North we have finished in 13th and 11th place. 2017-18 saw the Blues finish 9th and reach the final of the Suffolk Premier Cup.

2018-19 saw the Blues press for the play off places and a hope of a return to the Premier Division. It was a successful season with a 6th placed finished achieved, the best finish the club has had since relegation in 2015.

THIS isn't exactly breaking news but Jude Bellingham is really good at football. In fact, it's quite scary how good he is.

Aged just 19, he has spent the last few weeks in Qatar stamping his mark on the world stage as one of England's stand-out performers in their run to the World Cup quarter-finals.

Having set up the first in England's 3-0 win over Senegal, his drive and class also produced the second. Winning the ball back, galloping up the pitch, holding off his man, picking the optimum time to release a perfectly weighted ball into the path of Phil Foden.

While the country enthuses over the Borussia Dortmund midfielder, surely a future England captain, it's been tempting to lean over mid-game and say, 'Yeah, but did you hear about his dad?'

Goal machine doesn't do Mark Bellingham justice. Born in Southend, he netted his first goal for East Thurrock against Hordham YMCA way back in August 1994.

In 2016, by then a sergeant in West Midlands Police, he knocked in his 700th for Paget Rangers in Midland League Division Two.

"I've started to score a lot more tap-ins and the range is getting a lot shorter"

Bellingham told The NLP back at the time.
"The 700th was a free-kick which isn't regular for me at all, anything outside the box for me is abnormal!

"I needed 38 goals last season but got to 36 and then was banned for the last game because of a red card – my first ever sending-off.

"I was thinking over the summer whether it was the right time to go out, but with just two needed to reach 700, it felt like there was a bit of unfinished business.

"It's out of the way now so I can chill out.



I'll play as much as I can for Paget, who have been great with me, and hopefully score a few more!"

To get there he had prolific spells with the likes of Stourbridge, Leamington, Sutton Coldfield, Bromsgrove Rovers and Halesowen Town and reckoned his 700 haul came in 850 games.

I had the pleasure of speaking to Mark many times over the years as he racked up goal after goal, usually playing down his own qualities each time.

"i've managed my ability well, i've always said i'm not that great a player and although i'm still scoring, I am playing at Step 7!" he said.

"Most of the 700 were from not very far out so I think I owe my team-mates over the years a lot more than they owe me."

You don't score that many goals without possessing those priceless attributes that help stick the ball in the back of the net.

Of course his job in the police no doubt gave him a sense of perspective, but perhaps it's no surprise when we see the maturity Jude shows in front of the camera the influence his parents had on him and younger brother Jobe, who is also making his mark at Birmingham City.

As Jude told The FA in an interview last year: "When you go and watch him play every week in Non-League, you know it's not the Premier League or anything, but seeing the way that he played and the atmosphere, it made me fall in love with football so he was probably my first hero.

"After the first few times of going, I'd start to pay a bit more attention to the games and stuff, the atmosphere and he's scoring goals so you see him celebrating and stuff like that - you want that to be me."

It certainly is now.

I dug up the old interview with Bellingham senior from his 700th goal this week and the



sign off to asking how much longer he would carry on is fitting.

"I'm 40 now so I think this season will probably be my last," he said. "I'm playing veterans' football a bit more on Sundays and my eldest son is now playing for Birmingham U16s - maybe it's time to finally step away."

Bellingham junior is certainly making that decision worth it.

THE DISGRACE OF GIJON

'We will dedicate our seventh goal to our wives, and the eighth to our dogs,' announced the West Germany side as they went into the 1982 World Cup. They had won the competition eight years previously, on home ground, and although hadn't made the same impact in Argentina, were hopeful of adding a third World Cup to their tally back on European soil. Jupp Derwall's side cruise through qualifying unbeaten, scoring 33 goals, and boasted some of the starts of the age, chief among them Karl-Heinz Rummenigge. The group contained nothing to fear: Chile, who had claimed the final South American qualification place, and a decent but lacking Austria side. First up, though, were first-time qualifiers and plucky upstarts from Africa. 'If we don't beat Algeria,' guipped Derwall to the press, 'we'll take the next train home."



Algeria, though, were no untested minnows. The North African side were well drilled and played a quick passing game that was a match for anybody. Earlier in 1982 they had gone to the semi-finals of the African Nations Cup before losing to eventual winners Ghana, but they had their sights set on the biggest stage of all. They went into the World Cup hoping for a good showing, and maybe to pick up a win in their final game against Chile, which was expected to be meaningless.



It was unexpected, then, when Algeria proved quite the match for the Germans in the first half of their opening game. Quite apart from their pre-match predictions of eight goal victories, their crisp passing of the African side had them on the back foot, and West Germany had to hold on until the break to go in goalless. Derwall got into his side at half time and demanded improvement, but it didn't help. On 54 minutes Rabah Madjer reacted to a Harald Schumacher save and fired home. Algeria's first World Cup goal. That spurred West Germany into life, and they reacted. On 67 minutes Rummenigge equalised from close

range. But the complacency set in immediately, and right from kick off Algeria passed around the European side to restore their lead. This time they held on, and secured one of the biggest upsets in World Cup history.

West Germany kicked it up a gear in the second game of the tournament, beating Chile 4-1 to go level on points with Algeria, who lost a tighter than expected game (or perhaps not, after the first result) against Austria. The two European sides faced off in the final game, while Algeria needed to beat Chile to keep their hopes alive.

The Africans did just that, surviving a scare in their final game to win 3-2, but having to wait 24 hours for West Germany and Austria to play. With the benefit of hindsight, FIFA changed this arrangement so that the final group games are now played together, but that didn't help Algeria. Somebody worked out that a 1-0 West Germany win would see both them and Austria through, so that's what they ensured would happen.

The game had the atmosphere of a dead-rubber, and it only got worse as time went on. Horst Hrubesch scored the goal that the West Germans needed on the tenth minute, and then both sides just... stopped. No more attacking, no more chances, just some very polite passing to see the game out. The spectacle got more farcical as time went on, until the final whistle. Algeria were out.

It's called the Scandal of Gijon in Algeria. For the final thirty minutes, one commentator told his viewers to turn their televisions off and



refused to speak until the final whistle. Algeria cried foul, and FIFA did nothing. Germany fans bombarded the team hotel with water bombs out of shame. But Austria's representative Hans Tschak wasn't just unapologetic, he was downright outrageous. 'If 10,000 'son's of the desert'... want to trigger a scandal because of this is just shows they have too few schools' he said. 'Some Sheikh comes out of an oasis, is allowed to get a sniff of World Cup air after 300 years, and thinks he's entitled to open his gob.' It was an embarrassing end to the group for all involved.

Algeria's appeal was rejected, without much explanation, but after the scandal at the 1978 World Cup, where Argentina had won 6-0 in their final group game because their rivals had played earlier, they did take the opportunity to change the format slightly. For forty years since that tournament, final group games are played at the same time to try to limit the advantage. West Germany went all the way to the final, but Algeria will always have been robbed by the Disgrace of Gijon.
