Happy New Year to you all and welcome to the AGL Arena for the first of a quick-fire home double. First up we welcome Rod Stringer's Brentwood Town side for our second meeting this season, the first a 1-1 draw on the opening day. Following that we face Ben Channery's Bury Town following our postponement during the country's cold snap last month.

Looking back to our last management notes as we approached the Coggeshall game we were optimistic of a positive result and performance. That, unfortunately, was as close as we came. On reflection it had been 24 days since our last game and that certainly showed in a sluggish display against what was certainly a revitalised Coggeshall team since their managerial change.

We then faced a challenge at the opposite end of the table as we faced a Stowmarket side who had lost just one league game since August and were unbeaten at home. Callum Robinson produced a man of the match performance to secure a point in a match that a below-par Seasiders could and should have lost. Despite leading at half time through a Charlie Warren goal, Felixstowe can count themselves

fortunate that a combination of poor finishing and some fine goalkeeping denied the visitors what would have been their first league victory of the season.

New Coggeshall Manager Jason Maher had brought in five new players in the past fortnight and the former Grays striker Josh Osude transformed the basement clubs attacking threat throughout the game, creating numerous golden opportunities, including five one on one chances that he could not convert. **Charlie Warren** placed his 33rd minute shot into the bottom corner after good build up play from Zak Brown to give Felixstowe a half time lead, with Ryan Dear heading high into the roof of

Match Report: Stuart Daynes the net from a pinpoint cross in the 47th minute to equalise for the away side. Felixstowe failed to turn some decent possession into goal attempts and it was the visitors who time and time again were denied by Callum Robinson, the woodwork, some poor finishing and a goal line clearance that the away bench were convinced had struck the hand of a defender. Zak Brown was upended in the box for what looked like a clear penalty as the game progressed and Coggeshall got increasingly frustrated at the officials and their wasted opportunities. This frustration got out of hand in the 82nd minute with a Coggeshall player launching the ball from close range into the Felixstowe dugout and striking a coach's lower half, this led to a mass brawl that saw two red cards produced for Coggeshall and one for a so far undetermined member of the home bench. With Coggeshall down to nine men and several minutes on the clock, the home crowd sensed an opportunity to snatch the points but again it was Osude who had the best chance to win the game, and



again he was denied by Robinson when a goal looked a certainty.

Stuart Boardley spoke after the match. "We were disappointing today, we were lethargic,





we looked like we'd had a good Christmas! And that was a hard watch as we just didn't have any tempo to our play, didn't have any positivity or forward-thinking, it was just very very flat. You could argue that before the game that would be considered as two points dropped but at the end it's probably one point gained as I thought Coggeshall were the better side. Their goal was disappointing to concede but Callum has gone on to save us so many times at point blank range to keep us in the game. We just huffed and puffed and it really was a poor showing, three weeks without a game is just not conducive to

keeping yourself going, but no excuses, we weren't at the races today and they were, and they've come here and got a point. If we had of performed anywhere near to our best we would have won comfortably here today, no disrespect intended to Coggeshall, but of course I'm disappointed to only take a point home as on paper and before the game it should really have been three points for us".

THE OTHER SIDE BRENTWOOD TOWN

The original Brentwood FC dates back to the 19th century and the club saw some success in those early days, reaching the quarter-final of the FA Cup in 1886 where they were beaten 3-1 by Blackburn Rovers.

In the 1950s and 1960s the club operated as Brentwood & Warley FC and were three times winners of the Delphian League. In 1965 the club turned 'professional' becoming Brentwood Town FC.

The late 60s saw great success for the club as they rapidly rose to the heights of non-league football. Brentwood Town became a force to be reckoned with in the Southern League Premier Division, reaching the third round proper of the FA Cup in the 1969/70 season. But following their successful run the club subsequently folded and amalgamated with Chelmsford City.

The current club was founded in 1954 as Manor Athletic playing from King George's Playing Fields in Hartswood. From 1957 to 1993 the Club played at Larkins Playing Fields on the Ongar Road.

With help from the local council, Brentwood found a new home at The Brentwood Centre, where they played their first match in October 1993. In 2004 the Essex County FA officially gave the club permission to change its name and re-adopt the title of Brentwood Town FC.


Brentwood FC won the Essex Senior League title for the first time in the 2000/01 season and reached the final of the league cup in the 2005/06 season, losing 2-0 to Hornchurch. Under the management of Steve Witherspoon and Amin Levitt the 2006/07 was the most successful in the club's history as they won the Essex Senior League championship title and both league cup competitions to complete a treble. That also meant promotion to the Isthmian League North Division. In the 2007/08



season, the team performed well in the FA Cup and FA Trophy, and closely missed out on a play-off place, finishing sixth in the league.

The 2014/15 season saw more impressive victories, thanks to 10 players who had progressed through the youth pathway, leading the team to the Ryman North play-offs and achieving promotion to the Isthmian Premier League for the first time. This was the highest league status ever reached by the current Brentwood Town club and was obtained thanks to the skilled guidance of Adam Flanagan, the 2014/15 Manager. Adam subsequently moved on to manage Concord and Dartford in the National League South.

The biggest name in football to have played for the club has to be the great Jimmy Greaves! Jimmy signed for Brentwood in December 1975, aged 34. You could be sure that whenever Jimmy was part of the team, you could add hundreds of additional spectators to the normal gate numbers.



Thanks to the guidance and investment from the current Chairman, Jez Dickinson, the club was awarded a Charter Standard recognition from the FA in 2020 this marked the start of what the club expects to be an exciting journey progressing up the football pyramid.

With Rod Stringer taking over as manager in October 2021, the aim is to take Brentwood Town FC to play at a hight level.



THE OTHER SIDE PLAYER PROFILES

Rod Stringer – Manager, Rod was appointed in October 2021 and has previously achieved success wherever he has been, starting at Barkingside and Aveley, then moving on to Braintree, Bishop's Stortford and Chelmsford City.



Harry Girling – Goalkeeper signed from Tilbury in February this season, Harry has previously played for Millwall, Welling United and Leatherhead.

Jake Anderson – Goalkeeper Jake is one of the youngest in the squad having joined Brentwood two seasons ago and has had some 1st team experience.

Andy Freeman – Midfielder Andy came through the youth and under-21 teams and established himself in the 1st team by the end of the 2014/15 season, winning the player of the year award in 2015/16. Andy moved to National South club Concord Rangers during the 2017/18 season and spent 2018/19 with Aveley before returning to the Arena for the start of the 2019/20 season.



Connor Hogan – midfielder who came through the club youth system and has also played for Hornchurch, Aveley, Brightlingsea Regent, VCD Athletic and East Thurrock United before returning to Blues in summer 2019.

Jack Dickinson – midfielder who has come through the club youth teams and now a regular in the first team squad.

Matt Cripps – Defender Matt spent the last few seasons playing in the Isthmian Premier with Brightlingsea Regent. He was captain of the side and was a key component when they were crowned champions of the Isthmian North division. Matt was duly selected within the league team of the year.

Joe Heath - Central defender Joe had a great season playing for our Essex rivals Great Wakering Rovers where they had one of the best defensive records in the league. Joe then played for Blues in 20/21 and re-joined Brentwood Town in February 2022 after a brief spell with East Thurrock United.

Tom Richardson - Forward, a player who knows how to win promotion out of this league. In his first spell at the club Tom was part of the play-off winning team. He then joined Brightlingsea Regent and played a key role in their Championship win and has subsequently played at Conference South level for East Thurrock United and Braintree Town. Tom is first team captain at Brentwood and was the league's leading goal scorer last season.

Jack Humphrey - Central defender signed from Heybridge Swifts and made his debut against Maldon & Tiptree in October 2021.

Sam Park - One of the longest serving players in this squad, Sam has been a regular member of the 1st team squad this season. Sam progressed through the youth section and Reserves and has pretty much played everywhere on the pitch at some point.



Charlie Kendall – Midfielder signed from Tilbury in March 2022, Charlie is a former Bournemouth youth player who has also played in the Isthmian League for Basildon United and Heybridge Swifts.

Chris Gregan - Full back Chris is a summer 2022 signing having previously played for Heybridge Swifts, Bishop's Stortford, Bowers & Pitsea, Harlow Town and Chelmsford City.

George Craddock - Experienced midfielder who started his career at Northampton Town. He has also represented Welling United, Margate and East Thurrock at Conference South level. Now in his second season at Brentwood George spent the previous few seasons at Heybridge Swifts where he was club captain.

Anthony Furlonge – Full back Anthony is in his second spell with Blues, re-signing from New Salamis early this season. A former Southend United U18, Anthony has also played for Stevenage, Bishop's Stortford, Chelmsford City, Cheshunt and Great Wakering Rovers.

Daniel Ogunleye – Forward. After academy spells at Southampton and Forest Green, Daniel returned to the club last season, scoring eight goals in the team's run to the play-off final. He started this season at Coggeshall Town before returning to The Arena in November 2022.

Luke Hirst – Forward. Signed from Barking in November 2022, Luke has previously played for Hashtag United, Basildon United, Bowers & Pitsea and IFK Mora in Sweden.

Jeremiah Amoo – A wide, attacking mdfielder, Jerry joined Blues early in the 2022/23 season. He was a West Ham Under-18 and has since played for Chelmsford City, Leatherhead, Bishop's Stortford, Whitehawk and East Grinstead.

Flavio Jumo – Former Basildon United forward who signed for Blues in October 2022.

the ball up and laid it off for Canfs who smashed it into the roof of the net from 25 yards, a superb goal. We fully controlled the first half for the entirety, start to finish, played some really good stuff and deserved to get a penalty when George Clarke was brought down in the box, Joe Whight converted that and 3-0 did not flatter us at all at half time. They had missed a penalty just before half time that came against the run of play but I thought we were simply superb first half. Second half we came out and despite the message to the players being that we don't want to change anything, we want to keep pushing for more goals, inevitably it's human nature that they do change things, they had come out with renewed energy and fire and got themselves back into the game, then another goal from a set-piece, a header at the near post which is disappointing. We also had our chances; Noel Aitkens struck the post with a stunning strike from 20 yards

THE OTHER SIDE BURY TOWN

Founded in 1872, Bury Town Football Club is one of the oldest Football Club's in the country and has a proud history dating back over 140 years. The club was founded by Mr William Lake at a meeting in the Suffolk Hotel. The original name of the club was Bury St Edmunds FC and the first committee of the club elected to choose royal blue as the club's colours.

The club took up residence at Kings Road, also know as the Cemetery Road ground, in 1888. Kings Road was the first football ground in East Anglia to operate floodlights when on Monday 12th January 1953, the Blues played their first ever floodlit game against Cambridge City in front of 2,105 spectators. A total of 14 bulbs of 1500 watts illuminated the Suffolk skyline for the first time and history was created. The lights were financed by the Bury Town Supporters Club.



A notable player for the club in the early days was Reginald De Courtney Welch who appeared as a defender for Bury St Edmunds in 1877. De Courtney Welch was a member of The Wanderers side that won the first ever FA Cup in 1872 and he also played in the first ever official international match for England, against Scotland in November 1872.

The club was one of 11 founder members of the Suffolk County Football Association in 1885 and has won the Suffolk Premier Cup on 13 occasions.

The clubs name was changed by a vote to Bury Town in September 1885, however 10 years



later the members chose to adopt the full name of the town back as the name, before changing to Bury United in 1908. In 1923 the clubs members decided that the name 'United' was no longer appropriate as there were a number of sides in Bury St Edmunds, and decided to revert to Bury Town, which has remained to this day.

The club played in various local leagues until 1935 when it became a founder member of the Eastern Counties League. The club spent a total of 22 consecutive seasons in the Eastern Counties League, finishing as runners up in 1937-38. The Blues claimed the ECL title in the 1963-64 season as part of an historic treble, as they also captured the ECL Knockout Cup and the Suffolk Premier Cup.

This success saw the club move to the Metropolitan League and they kicked off their first ever Metropolitan game against Charlton Athletic 'A' at Kings Road in front of 1,150 spectators, Bury running out 1-0 winners. The club finished 4th in their first season and also retained the Suffolk Premier Cup.

Season 1965-66 was another successful season and another treble haul of trophies as the club stormed to the Metropolitan League title, won the Metropolitan League Cup and the Suffolk Premier Cup again. By this time the club were averaging over 1,000 supporters at their home matches and interest in the club was at an all time high.

In 1968, the Blues reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup and drew Third Division side Bournemouth & Boscombe at Kings Road. 3,000 spectators assembled and witnessed Bury hold the Football League side to a goalless draw. The replay saw Bournemouth win through by 3 goals to 0 at Dean Court. The season had further success when the Blues won the Metropolitan League title for a second time.

The clubs success resulted them taking the bold step to join the Southern Football League for the 1971-72 season. The club struggled to adapt to their new surroundings and after five seasons, decided to take the decision to re-join the Eastern Counties League, a decision that



proved unpopular with supporters.

On Wednesday 28th April 1976, Bury Town played their final match at the historic Kings Road ground when West Ham United were the visitors. 1,750 watched on as the sides drew 2-2, and a pitch invasion signalled the end of the Blues spiritual home.

Bury Town moved into their current Ram Meadow ground in 1978 and collected the Suffolk Premier Cup as a reward. The Blues spent a total of 11 seasons back in the ECL and their most successful moment of that time came in their final season when the reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup and were drawn away at Football Conference leaders Enfield. The sides drew 0-0 at Southbury Road and returned to Ram Meadow for the replay, however in front 2,500 supporters, the visitors sneaked home 1-0 to reach the First Round Proper.

The 1987-88 season saw ambition return to the club and Bury were promoted to the Southern League. After a few seasons of promising results and large home crowds, the Blues failed to reach the Premier Division, the closest they came was finishing 4th in 1988-89. Years of overspending on players and ground improvements finally caught up and the club drifted into decline as the crowds drifted away. On the 4th May 1996, the Blues were relegated at Redditch United from the Midland Division of the Southern League, back to the Eastern Counties League.



The club spent another 10 years in the ECL, and despite some early seasons of struggles, success coincided with the appointment of former Colchester United captain Richard Wilkins



to the manager's seat. The club reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 2005 and then the Semi Final in 2006. Crowds rose back up and after two consecutive runners up spots in the Premier Division of the ECL, the club were promoted to the Isthmian League for the first time in their history. The stay lasted two seasons and after adjusting to a higher level in 2006–07 with a 17th place finish, the following season saw the Blues finish in 7th position.

The FA re-organisation in 2008 saw Bury moved into the Southern League for a third spell of membership. A successful campaign saw Bury finish in 7th position in the Midland Division table, reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing 4-2 at Alfreton Town, and reach the Semi Final of the Southern League Cup, however in 2009-10, Bury Town clinched the Southern League Midland Division Championship on the final day of the season with a 3-0 home victory over Marlow in front of 1,550 supporters. The Blues piped Hitchin Town to the title, scoring 115 goals during the campaign and collecting 102 points to gain promotion. Another move across the pyramid saw the Blues re-join the Ryman League for the 2010-11 season, entering the Premier Division. A great season saw Bury finish third, but go out of the play off's to Lowestoft Town. There was however some silverware for the boardroom as Bury defeated Needham Market 2-0 in the final of the Suffolk Premier Cup at Portman Road.

20011-12 saw the club lift the Ryman League Cup with a victory over East Thurrock United and again finished in the play off places, but lost out to AFC Hornchurch in the Semi Final. 2014-15 saw our spell in the Premier Division come to an end after 5 years with relegation to Division One North. In our last two seasons back in Division One North we have finished in 13th and 11th place. 2017-18 saw the Blues finish 9th and reach the final of the Suffolk Premier Cup.

2018-19 saw the Blues press for the play off places and a hope of a return to the Premier Division. It was a successful season with a 6th placed finished achieved, the best finish the club has had since relegation in 2015.



THE OTHER SIDE PLAYER PROFILES



MANAGER – BEN CHENERY Ben became manager of the Club in June 2014 after spending 2 years as Assistant Manager. He previously has managerial experience with Chelmsford City and has played professional football for Cambridge and Luton, as well as playing for a host of top flight non-league clubs, and is best remembered for scoring the winning goal for Canvey Island in the 2001 FA Trophy Final at Villa Park.

SHAUN AVIS Striker Shaun joined from Thurlow Nunn League side Lakenheath FC in October 2022, just shortly after he had hit 100 goals during 2 spells with the Heath. Has also played locally at Mildenhall Town, Newmarket Town and Saffron Walden Town. He played at Step 4 during Mildenhall's brief spell in the Isthmian League and his goalscoring record has given him a chance to step up again.

CHARLEY BARKER D.O.B 26-12-1998: Midfielder Charley joined having been with St Neots Town in the Southern League last season. The 23 year old began his career in the youth ranks at Leyton Orient, and then spent time with Cheltenham Town, Wingate & Finchley and Northwood. He then joined Isthmian Premier Division side Haringey Borough and played in their live televised FA Cup 1st Round match with AFC Wimbledon and was part of the successful side that reached the play off's.

OLLIE FENN Joined on a month's loan from Needham Market in February 2016 but made the permanent switch in 2017. Ollie previously played for Ipswich Town Academy and Irish Premier League side Galway United and is one of the more experienced members of the squad and club captain.

WILL GARDNER Defender Will re-joined from Soham Town Rangers after a couple of seasons representing the Greens in the Isthmian North. He previously had a short spell with us after leaving Haverhill Rovers in the Eastern Counties League and after a couple of years more experience at Soham in this division he is a valuable addition to the side.

AFC Sudbury take three more points - just whilst Hashtag hit four. Brentwood also get four, Swifts get back to winning ways, Felixstowe win our match of the day, whilst Wroxham, Grays and Maldon continue their winning runs.

Bottom v top might have looked like an away win certainty, but an improving **Coggeshall Town** made **AFC Sudbury** work incredibly hard to maintain their four point lead. The match had only one goal, and it arrived just six minutes from time, Josh Stokes with it – but by that point the Yellows were down to ten men, Harrison Chatting seeing red. The Seed Growers remain ten points from safety, but will be buoyed by their recent performances despite still searching for their first league victory.

Second place **Hashtag United** had been in fine form, with nine wins from ten - and made it ten wins from eleven with a comfortable victory at **Witham Town**. The hosts made it easy for them by going down to ten men before the half hour, Luke Ige seeing red, but they were already a goal down by then, Percy Kiangebeni with the opener. Six minutes before the break Kiangebeni made it two, and there was time for a third before the break, Thomas Anderson with that one.

Alex Teniola added his eighth of the season in the early stages of the second half, and that was that- the Tags four points behind the leaders. That's three wins in a row for United against Witham, and ten goals scored.

Stowmarket Town lost for the first time since August 16th as they fell to defeat at Wroxham last time out, and it was two defeats in two as they welcomed Felixstowe and Walton United. The Seasiders got off to a flyer, Charlie Warren opening the scoring on two minutes, and it was two-nil on ten minutes as Ollie Canfer added another. The third arrived midway through the first half, Joe Whight with that one, but if the visitors thought the game was as good as over they were wrong, as the hosts woke up in the last half an hour. Chris Casement got a goal back just after the hour, and with eleven

minutes left Ollie Sotoyinbo made the closing stages interesting - but the equaliser didn't arrive, and only goal difference keeps Felixstowe out of the top five.

Lowestoft Town ended a four match winless run by defeating neighbours Gorleston comprehensively last time out, and they were quickly ahead at Bury Town, Sam Johnson opening the scoring after just seven minutes. They then made life rather difficult for themselves as keeper Luke Holt saw red with only nineteen minutes on the clock, defender Sam Nunn ending up in goal. When Ashley Boatswain equalised for the hosts it looked as if they would go on and win; however they couldn't capitalise on their advantage and the ten men held on for a point. Bury also ended up with ten men, Cruis Nydazayo seeing red just before the end.

Heybridge Swifts took a run of three straight defeats - and five without a win - to Great Wakering Rovers, and got back to winning ways, if only just. The only goal of the game went to Sam Carter after twenty eight minutes, and it was enough to send Swifts back up to third.

We'd a local derby as East Thurrock United welcomed Grays Athletic. The visitors looked to be approaching their best once more, winning three of their last four and - of course - hitting seven last weekend, and they delivered another win in front of five hundred and fifty two at Rookery Hill. Sam Bantick has been a big part of their best moments this season, and he opened the scoring seven minutes before the break with his fifteenth of the campaign. The goal action then came to an end until the final moments, Cheyce Grant making it two-nil to the visitors before Jordan Peart got one back for the Rocks. Athletic climb to seventh, a point behind fifth place Lowestoft.

New Salamis and **Basildon United** managed a goal each – both coming from the spot.

Michael Salako gave the hosts the lead nine minutes before the break, with Derek Asamoah's seventeenth of the season earning his side a point with seventeen minutes remaining.

Brentwood Town got back to winning ways against Tilbury - the Dockers boss John Coventry losing his position as a result. Solomon Ogonwomoju gave the Blues a fifth minute lead only for Charlie Morris to quickly equalise, but the hosts were ahead eight minutes before the break, George Craddock making it two-one. It was three for the Blues just after the hour, James Folkes with the goal, but the Dockers quickly reduced the arrears, David Knight bringing it back to three-two. Six minutes from time Daniel Ogunleye got a fourth for the hosts, and secured three points.

Wroxham's best run of the campaign - culminating in that victory over Stowmarket Town last time out - had seen them climb to the heady heights of thirteenth place; and it got even better for the Yachtsmen, who extended their unbeaten run to seven with victory at Gorleston. Ryan Curtis opened the scoring for the visitors on twenty five minutes only for the hosts to level before the break through Adam Tann. The winner arrived six minutes from time, Jordan King sending his side up to twelfth.

Finally, Maldon & Tiptree, fresh from that morale-boosting win over local rivals Heybridge Swifts last time out, finally climbed out of the bottom four with a win over Hullbridge Sports. The winning goal came from new signing Terrell Egbri after sixteen minutes, and it sent the Jammers up to the heady heights of fourteenth place.

NEW YEAR, new you? If you're anything like me, those resolutions will already be a little frayed around the edges.

But as the big clock struck midnight to bring in 2023, it's only natural to look back at the previous 12 months and look ahead to what might be in the ones ahead.

You may have caught it in last week's NLP, but each year we ask a group of people who, like us, love Non-League football and ask the same question – what would you like to see in the coming year.

My own answer, three-up, three-down from the National League into the EFL aside, centres around concussion substitutes. I really believe it's time temporary subs were allowed to give the experts time to assess any potential concussion and ensure the player is given the right care.

We saw it a couple of times in the World Cup where a player clearly played on when he shouldn't have. Allowing some time for him to go off to a quiet part of the stadium and let those in the know run through their protocols is only right. Hopefully it comes in.

Our north-east reporter Mark Carruthers is banging the drum for three-up, three-down in 2023 – it's got to happen soon enough, surely, and a sentiment echoed by BBC Surrey Sport commentator Rob Worrall, who said, 'Without doubt, an additional promotion place from the National League to the EFL. It simply HAS to happen now, with benefits to all – including those 'big' clubs that keep dropping down!'

His colleague at the NL Full Time podcast, Rich Worton, agrees but has an equally seismic change he'd like to be introduced too.

"Is it too obvious to say 'three up, three down' between the EFL and the National League? If it is, then I'd go for a different choice,



and say that the implementation of the Crouch report's recommendations and the appointment of an independent regulator for football would be hugely positive, and a sign that the government does care about the national game, rather than just doing so when it is expedient."

Our executive editor Jon Couch would like to see the way games are postponed handled differently. In this current cost of living climate, clubs arriving at grounds only for the game never likely on to be called off is frustrating to say the least.

Another of our regular reporters, Andy Mitchell, is hacked off with how some approach the FA

Trophy. He says: "Stop dismissing FA Trophy. The influx of clubs from the Football League has seen the FA Trophy relegated from the non-league FA Cup to a par with the Papa John's Trophy.

It has a Wembley final and provides memories that last a lifetime – the big guns should take it seriously." Indeed.

What would you like to see changed or introduced in Non-League in 2023? As long as it's not VAR we'll all be fine!

A SWEDISH KNIGHT, AN ENGLISH VISIONARY

It isn't even five minutes into the 1958 World Cup final when Nils Liedholm picks up the ball. He beats the first man, and then the second. Finding himself in space, is shoots, and the net billows. The Swedish home crowd erupts, and they lead Brazil. On the touchline, at the pinnacle of a remarkable career, stands an Englishman. George Raynor may not be much remembered in his homeland, but his services to football earned him a Swedish knighthood, and he could be the most consistently successful international manager England has ever produced.



Sent to Iraq as a fitness instructor to the Ninth Army, the former footballer encouraged his sport. When Prime Minister Nuri Al-Said decided that his country needed a football team, there was one obvious candidate. Raynor became the first manager of the Iraq national side, overseeing exhibition matches against Lebanon and Syria, as well as



representative teams from the British and Polish militaries.

Following the war, Raynor returned home, but his progressive style was difficult to implement. After losing his job at Aldershot, he met with another forward-thinker, Sir Stanley Rous, who suggested the Sweden needed a coach to prepare for the 1948 Olympics. Not an easy task for a country that still demanded amateur football. But Raynor was blessed, and Sweden were dripping with talent. Gunnar Gren and Nils Liedholm were the creative force, while Gunnar Nordahl was an unbelievably prolific striker. Under Raynor, the Swedes scored a remarkable 22 goals in their four games as the romped to the gold medal. It is still Sweden's greatest footballing triumph.

Following that success, there was clearly a lot of European interest in Raynor's players,

and Gren, Liedholm and Nordahl all moved to Milan, forming the famous Gre-No-Li. Nordahl's two brothers, also integral parts of the national team, went to Italy too. Unfortunately, this was the end of their international careers, as Raynor was unable to call up professional players.

Not for the last time, Raynor had to rebuild. Committed to the improvement of Swedish football he took charge at AIK alongside his international commitments, winning the Swedish Cup twice before turning his focus to Brazil in 1950.

Such were the limitations, Raynor's World Cup squad of 22 players included 14 who hadn't been good enough to make the Olympic squad just two years earlier. But after four years in charge, Raynor had his team purring. Their first match was against Italy, the nation that had deprived them of so many players and the reigning world champions. Sweden dispatched them, 3-2. It was the Azzurri's first loss at a World Cup. A draw with Paraguay saw them into the final group stage, but losses to Brazil and Uruguay cost them a chance at the big prize. Sweden ran out a creditable third.

Raynor would repeat his third place finish at the 1952 Olympics, despite ten more of his World Cup squad leaving for professional football, before the job of constantly rebuilding the side became too much. In 1954, to the dismay of Swedish football fans, he left for Juventus.

Unfortunately, his club career didn't match his international one. Quickly moved out of Turin, he initially did well to save Lazio from relegation. Sweden, catastrophically, failed to qualify for the 1954 World Cup without him, something that finally prompted the FA to consider professionalism. Suddenly a whole host of exceptional Swedish talent was available once more.

Raynor moved back to England and took charge of third division Coventry City as Sweden prepared to host the 1958 World Cup. But it was too strong a love affair, and when the Englishman was dismissed from his post in the Midlands, Scandinavia came calling again. One last shot at the big prize, with a home



crowd and the cream of Swedish talent.

Raynor's Sweden looked every bit the force that surprised Europe for much of the previous decade, beating Hungary and Mexico before drawing with Wales, with qualification secured. They saw off a strong Soviet side in the quarter finals and the reigning champions, West Germany, in the semi-final, setting up an exciting tie with Brazil. Sadly, for Swedish hopes, this was merely the swansong of their golden age, while their opponents were right at the start of theirs, which would eclipse all others. Vava equalised and then gave Brazil the lead, before Pele took charge as Brazil romped to their first World Cup victory. It was the last international match for Raynor, and he returned to his homeland.

Recognising his brilliance, and with English football desperately needing to evolve, the only work he could find was with non-league Skegness Town.

Enjoy the game.
