INTERVIEW with JOSH HITTER

As the season draws to a close I caught up with one of the club's stand out performers and leading goalscorer Josh Hitter...

You are Seasiders leading goalscorer this season, and the league's ninth leading goalscorer with a total of 14 league goals to date, is this something you knew you had in your locker at the beginning of the season?

If I'm honest, I didn't expect to score as many as I have this season and is a contrast from last year. I think what has helped me is the consistent run of games and being able to be as sharp as possible going into games. Once you are on a run of scoring it seems you get a few more chances than when your'e not scoring. I'm hoping to have a few more before the end of the season, and getting into double figures playing in midfield is something that I think I've got to be delighted with.

Which is the best goal you've scored, in your opinion?

I'd say there are a couple to choose from - the away goal against Grays was up there but I think the free kick at home against Great Wakering Rovers pips it as you don't always hit them as sweet as that!







You've been an integral part of the team for this campaign, and in my opinion have shown vast improvements this season, what has changed and how have those around you helped develop your game?

It's nice to hear that. I personally think not playing for the club as much as I would have hoped to last season is something I've worked really hard to rectify. Not being involved in the playoff game against Canvey Island hurt a little, and I've made sure I've been in and amongst it to play every game this season. I went away pre-season, maybe a little hurt by not playing as much as I wanted, and I made sure I came back fitter then the previous season after the covid pandemic.

You've played in many positions for the club, what is your preferred position that you feel draws on your strengths?

I've played in various positions and sometimes it's a hinderance being versatile being able to play in 4 or 5 different positions! Generally the number 10 is where I've played my best football this year and playing on the right has been something I've had to get used to after not playing there since youth football. As long as the



team is winning games and playing well, if I can help in a certain position on the pitch I won't groan about it and will give my very best for the team.

You've shown us that you're a deadly free kick taker, do you have to fight it out with Callum Harrison/Joe Whight as to take the free kicks? Who does it better? I think if you ask the boys they'll say themselves but I think it's healthy having three lads able to step up to free kicks and feel comfortable scoring from them. I think with the ones I've scored this season I'm still in the running to take them, but I think how you're playing that game and the confidence you have is the main factor.

It's been a hectic end to the season with 4 games in 10 days, do you feel you have the strength in the squad to push on and keep the playoff dream alive?

As a team we like being around each other, and I think as a group we don't want to look back at all the games we've played this year with regret and fall just short. We will be doing everything we can to put our

sparkling performance in the twice postponed match with a 95th minute clincher from Zak Brown the icing on the cake to send the home supporters away happy. Billy Holland had put Felixstowe ahead on 35 minutes with the away side levelling things on 54 minutes following an error at the back. Leon Ottley-Gooch restored the advantage on 66 minutes before Zak stole the show in injury time.

Felixstowe were almost at full strength, with just Harry Knock, George Clarke on the injury list. Miles Grimes was rested ahead of Saturdays game at Witham and Zak Brown started on the bench following his injury withdrawal during last Saturday's loss

at Bury Town. Stowmarket were without the influential Tom Bullard but featured former Seasider, and brother of Stuart, Jack Ainsley.

It was a fairly tame start to the match, both sides were playing decent passing football but chances were at a premium early on with Felixstowe having the first real effort on 10 minutes, Callum Harrison firing a 20-yard free kick inches over the bar. Callum Robinson headed a long forward ball clear a minute later with Billy Holland working his magic to halt the Stowmarket forward in his tracks as he looked to take advantage of the empty goal. Ollie Canfer then crossed from the left to Josh Hitter to head just wide on 12 minutes. Harrison was having a fine game and his burst forward on 15 minutes was only stopped at the third attempt as he reached the edge of the area and his shot was blocked. Charlie Warren created space on the left shortly after to tee up Billy Holland who crossed into the box for Canfer who headed over. Canfer dispossessed Bradbrook at the byline on 28 minutes but two defenders cleared up as he looked to cross

into space. The goal Felixstowe were craving came on 35 minutes, the ball was loose in the box and **Billy Holland** struck a low shot towards the right side of the goal, it seemed to creep under Bradbrook, perhaps helped by the wet surface after a heavy shower, and spun over the line. Straight from kick off, Stowmarket had their best chance so far, an angled effort from



18 yards flew just wide of the far post with Robinson seemingly beaten. Josh Hitter shot wide on 40 minutes after racing forward onto a delightful through ball as Felixstowe looked to increase their advantage before the break. Callum Harrison nearly got that crucial second goal with a stunning strike on 42 minutes, his volley from the right beating the goalkeeper and thumping the inside of the far post, the ball was then scrambled away from the line as Holland looked to capitalise on the rebound. Bradbrook was again the saviour a minute later as the pressure increased further, Warren threading a ball through two defenders to Hitter at the left post whose close-range effort was well saved. Stowmarket had the final chance of the half and it came via a good ball through from Jack Ainsley, it set up a 35-yard effort that Robinson did well to get down to and cover.

The visitors had the first chance of the second half, a shot fired inches wide when in a with his ball through to Ollie Canfer on 49 minutes, Canfers shot was deflected wide by the goalkeeper. It was end to end now and Robinson punched clear a dangerous ball on 50 minutes, but 4 minutes later a punch out fell straight to Jack Wilkinson who had a simple task of smacking the ball in and levelling things up. 2 minutes later and Stowmarket shot way over the bar from a good position and Noel Aitkens tried his luck from 30-yards with a floating effort that just cleared the far upright. The home side retook the lead on 66 minutes as





Leon Ottley-Gooch found himself in the right place to slam the ball home from 10-yards after a fine cross from the left. Callum Harrison nearly got the goal he deserved on 70 minutes, his ferocious shot from 22-yards was heading just under the crossbar until Bradbrook somehow got a hand to it and tipped it over.

Stowmarket headed wide on 78 minutes as a nervousness started to spread around the ground due to the slender home lead. The nerves were nearly settled on 80 minutes when three quick-fire chances were denied in the Stowmarket box, Aitkens, Ainsley and Hitter all seeing shots blocked and saved in a frantic 20 second spell. On 90 minutes it was hearts in mouths time as the visitors somehow were denied an equaliser, a throw in was headed back towards the near post and Robinson could only divert it on to the bar, the rebound was headed down but wide with the away supporters beginning to celebrate what should have been a certain goal. The best action was saved for the last minute of injury time, Felixstowe had managed the game well for the added 5

minutes so far and the ball then came away towards half way, **Zak Brown** turned and nodded it through, beating two defenders and racing forward, most supporters, I would guess, would be expecting him to head for the corner flag but Zak had other ideas, instead holding off further defenders and launching an absolute rocket of a shot from the edge of the D to give Bradbrook no chance whatsoever, a truly stunning strike and a fitting end to an absorbing encounter that had been well worth the three day wait!

buse in all sport has now become a noticeably massive thing and especially in football. Since the advent of that day a year ago when some very high-profile players told their very distressing stories live on the Victoria Derbyshire show and subsequently brought about the advent and birth of the wonderful organisation. The Offside Trust who have done amazing work with no funding from The Football association at all to help them and a very minimal amount from the PFA. Their help has given me the strength to deal with what happened to me all those years ago as it did to them.

As a young child I wanted nothing more than to watch football, play football and be a professional footballer. My uncle used to take me to watch Luton Town from the age of seven onwards at first my uncle was wonderful nothing was too much trouble and enjoyed our visits to watch Luton at home and used to get extremely excited at around noon awaiting my uncle's arrival to take me and even have a kick about in the park before the game. Unfortunately, there was an ulterior motive I later found out to this as from the age of around nine we used to go to coaching sessions with a team on our way to football under the guise of they worked for Luton Town and if I did well, I would have a chance to fulfil my dreams.

Just as the season started and the coaching session became more intense, I was told that they could help me fulfil my dreams if I did something for them after the games. At first it was nothing too bad just touching etc of parts of their anatomy, but it slowly became a lot more sinister with more of our team involved

in some sadistic and sordid acts including being raped over one hundred times, some even photographed and filmed. When we left the so-called house, we were all given gifts and told that we must never tell anyone that these things had happened.

The older I got the more the acts became more depraved, and the threats became even more dreadful should we go to the police etc or even tell what had happened. I retreated into a shell on my return home and would turn into an insular and exceedingly difficult person. Luckily once I reached the age of twelve my uncle no longer came to get me and the trips to football stopped as luckily, I found a more local club to allow me to play. This club was well run and very safe with good coaches and it made me wonder what and why the original team coaches had asked me to do the things they did. I was still fearful of telling my parents so hid the sordid things away for many many years.

About 9 years ago I was summonsed to a meeting at a solicitor's office in London after my uncle had died and left his will. I was taken to a side room and given a letter from my uncle by the solicitor that he instructed me was going to be read out at the will reading. The letter detailed my uncles and his friends sordid past and was his was of asking the family for forgiveness from his crimes, unfortunately it was to be announced that he had abused a member of the family with his friends in an unbelievably bad way and wanted forgiveness.

THAT PERSON WAS ME

The family had no idea but as you can imagine it was exceptionally harrowing for me and my mum and sisters and really was difficult

for all to take, unfortunately I was blamed and called a liar by most of his side of the family meaning that I was cast aside as an outcast by that side of the family.

From that moment on I became an exceedingly difficult person to even talk to and took to drinking excessively ended up losing my wife, house, and a lot of family members. I also had to attend two court cases to see some of the dreadful people sentenced which was an exceedingly difficult experience.

As with all people that have suffered any sort of abuse, I tried to take my own life about a year ago but was found and have regular treatment from counsellors and doctors to ensure I can make the best recovery possible from these dreadful nightmares.

I apologise if this is harrowing reading, but it is the only way to get the message across and I will say I have left out the dreadful bits as no one should go through what I and my friends did for over those horrible years meaning most of us lost our childhood and still struggle dreadfully on the difficult days which we all still have.

SO, ULTIMATELY, Football Association chiefs finally made the only sensible call they could have made in granting an extension to the season for clubs at Steps 5 and 6.

But even though that affords the likes of Sandhurst Town, Brook House, Horndean and Bacup Borough a bit of breathing space from their ridiculous end-of-season fixture avalanche – Sandhurst having to play Il games in 10 days at one point – there is a bigger picture to consider here.

Tackling congested fixture pile-ups come March and April is no new dilemma for clubs these days, and therein lies the problem.

On average, you can expect to lose at least two or three league fixtures over the course of the season, but on the odd year of extraordinary weather patterns such as this, contingency plans have to be put in place.

It's not necessarily the regulation league season which is causing the problem – there are enough Saturdays and Tuesdays in the calendar to comfortably take in a 46-game season – but the numerous cup competitions which clubs are often obliged, or felt pressured to, compete in.

Take my old friends down at Fleet Town, for example. These days, the Blues ply their trade in the Wessex League Premier but that just scratches the surface of a gruelling first-team campaign which also takes in FA Cup, FA Vase, Wessex League Cup, Hampshire Senior Cup, Southern Combination Cup, Russell Cotes Cup and Aldershot Senior Cup.

Eagle-eyed readers of The NLP's extensive fixtures page may have noticed that there

are some regional or district cup competitions still trying to get through delayed second or third round matches. Indeed, for some, the backlog of fixtures is often so great that the competitions have. in the past, been carried over into the pre-season of the following campaign.

Sadly, though, one of Non-League football's great institutions is also implicated here – the County Cup.

This week, we saw two instances of National League clubs having to all but relinquish their challenge for honours at the semi-final stage due to fixture clashes.

Firstly, in Hampshire, we heard that Aldershot Town had been informed by the Hampshire Senior Cup sub-group that their semi-final tie against Basingstoke Town HAD to be played on Tuesday April 18.

But the Shots – proud six-time County Cup winners – had already rearranged their crucial National League game with Wealdstone for that date, meaning that despite their best efforts to arrange an alternative date, they had no choice but to fulfil their fixture but field their Under 21 academy side.

"The club wanted to move the fixture to give our supporters an opportunity to attend both our League fixture with Wealdstone and Cup fixture with Basingstoke but regret that unfortunately a choice between the two will have to be made," a club statement confirmed.

"We're incredibly proud of their achievements so far in this year's Hampshire Senior Cup and will be supporting the youngsters from Wealdstone."

And, it was the same story along the

south coast at Worthing.

Following the postponement of their National League South game with Cheshunt to a waterlogged pitch last week, the match was put back to the only available date left available, Tuesday April 25.

This, however, had been listed just 24 hours before the Rebels' already scheduled Sussex Senior Cup semi-final against Hastings United.

Despite constant dialogue with the National League and Sussex County FA to see if the congestion could be eased, a solution could not be found owing to "multiple factors", again meaning Worthing will have to field an under-strength side for the Hastings game with play-offs still very much in the offing.

Club chairman Barry Hunter commented: "Naturally this creates a huge conflict as it schedules us to play four games in eight days, which is not possible without compromise.

"We would also plan to speak with the Sussex FA at the end of the season in the hope we could work with them and other clubs to find ways to avoid the congestion experienced this season."

Barry is right, discussions do need to be had. Most supporters have some very fond

memories from their club's respective County Cup competitions and take great pride in claiming regional bragging rights should their club be lucky enough to lift the trophy.

But the fact remains that County FAs such as Hampshire and Sussex can't expect the likes of Aldershot and Worthing to put their whole season on the line at this crucial stage when there is still so much to play for in the league. If anything, they should be supporting their member clubs in their quest to achieve a highest possible league position. I mean, it's in their best interests, right?

The plight of Aldershot and Worthing – and no doubt other clubs up and down the country – will once again place the future of the County Cup into doubt.

Personally, I like to think they still have a part to play in the fabric of a Non-League season, but unless there is more understanding and flexibility in the fulfilling of priority fixtures, then the more difficulty I have in making an argument for it to remain on the modern-day fixture list.

Something, somewhere along the line surely has to give.

ITALY'S FIRST GIANTS

Italian football is home to some huge names. Milan, Inter, and Juventus epitomise what was once the dominant nation in Europe, and between them have a history beyond imagination. But among the storied names, among the memorable feats, sits a club who haven't seen anything remotely like glory in over a century, and whose chances of seeing any soon are remote in the extreme. Nestled just above Roma, Napoli and Fiorentina in the table of Italian success, with as many titles as all of them put together, are the unlikely heroes of Italian football: Pro Vercelli.

Situated equidistant between Milan and Turin, in the crowded footballing corner of northwest Italy, the small town of Vercelli seems an unlikely place for a generation of champions to have sprung up. The area is more famous for the growing of rice, an industry that dates back centuries, and for once being the home of the oldest public university in the world. It is not the kind of place you expect to find a team with seven league titles to their name; only six clubs in Italy have more.

The club was formed out of a local gym, who wanted something more competitive to do with their time than simply working out. This, it would prove, was fortuitous. Playing their first competitive match in 1903, they were made up mostly of health conscious teenagers, trying to be as fit as they could while they enjoyed themselves. Italian football, at the time, was already tending toward the more experienced end of the spectrum, making the upstarts from Piedmont, in some cases, nearly two decades younger than their opponents. Alongside

their beginnings in the gym, they outlasted their opponents repeatedly, and quickly made their way through the nascent Italian league system. By 1907, they had won their regional competition, and for the first time, were admitted to the national Italian championship.

The side was made up entirely of Italians, and mostly of Vercellians. One of them, midfielder Giuseppe Milano, made himself something of a hometown hero after his debut at the tender age of 19 in 1906, helping

guide Pro Vercelli into the top flight. In 1908, he was joined in the newly promoted side by two more homegrown stars, Carlo Rampini and Guido Ara. All three would usher in an era of success that, at that time, was unprecedented in Italian football, and all three would join an Italy side under Vittorio Pozzo that was taking its first steps. Milano was his captain.

With their superior fitness, the midfield dynamos of Ara and Milano, and the rampant goalscoring of Carlo Rampini, Pro Vercelli upset the early giants of Italian football, beating Juventus in the qualification rounds and then Inter and Sampdoria (under their historic names, US Milanese and Andrea Doria) in the final group stage to lift their first Italian championship. A year later, they achieved the feat again, and looked set for a period of dominance in Italian football.

The 1909-10 season, however, saw a revamp in the league system. Rather than a number of qualifying rounds followed by a championship group, the FIGC decided that it would be best to create what is now a traditional league division, with teams competing for points over the course of a season. A hard fought campaign saw the league finish with the newly named Internazionale level on points at the top with Pro Vercelli, with an (irrelevant)

inferior goal difference. A championship decider was hastily arranged, which clashed with commitments Pro Vercelli had already made. In protest, the two-time champions only sent a youth team to play the decider, which they duly lost. It was the only blip in what would become a phenomenal pre-war period.

Hurt by this turn of events, Pro Vercelli went home and prepared for their greatest period. Determined, experienced and aggrieved, Over the following three seasons they would lose only twice, securing three league titles before finally slipping just before the First World War, Five titles, the most successful club in Italian football.

Following the conflict, Guido Ara took charge of a new Pro Vercelli, leading them to two more titles in 1921 and 1922, a sparkling twilight for the old champions. But professionalisation made it difficult to compete with the bigger clubs, and slowly the large cities exerted their dominance. This was proven no more effectively than with the emergence of Silvio Piola. Pro Vercelli's record goalscorer brought with him dreams of a return to glory in the early 1930s, with the chairman of the small town club declaring that he wouldn't sell Piola for 'all the gold in the world', because it would be the death of his club. In 1934 however, the allure of Lazio became too strong. Piola moved to the capital and became Italian football's highest ever scorer. Proving the chairman correct, Pro Vercelli were relegated at the end of that season for the first time. They have never made it back to the top flight.
